YEAR IN REVIEW

Soaring to New Heights in 2019

We just completed one of the most successful years in the history of CT ABC, full of record-setting accomplishments, new achievements and opportunities. Thanks to our fantastic membership and hardworking staff, CT ABC continues to position itself as the premiere resource for the Connecticut construction industry.





Membership and Events

In 2019 we added a record breaking 34 new companies with a diverse collection of size, experience and skillset to the membership rolls. In addition to retaining 90% of our members from the previous year we ended 2019 with 213 total member companies — a record high in the 44 year history of our association. Along with a larger membership comes better opportunities for business development, training and a much greater presence in Hartford and in town halls across the state as we advocate for issues that are important to us.

Our fantastic events are a big reason for our growth and in 2019 we built upon our characteristically packed calendar. While we continued our successful staples, the Annual Meeting, Golf outing, Excellence in Construction Awards and Holiday Party- we added a new networking series, Brews with Builders. This four event series attracted nearly 400 attendees and provided great opportunities for our members to meet and interact with one another in an informal and fun setting.


We also held the 8th Annual Construction Career Days event in May with more than 1,000 high school students in attendance learning about rewarding careers in the trades. Our event earned a good deal of publicity this year with live TV coverage from Fox61 and NBC 30. This is an important event for the construction industry as we continue to face a shortage of skilled workers in Connecticut and across the country.

Education & Training

This was an exciting year for education and training at CT ABC and our training arm, the Construction Education Center. We continue to offer high quality training opportunities for apprenticeship, continuing education, professional development and safety. In May, the Construction Education Center graduated 21 apprentices including 16 from CT ABC member companies and this fall we were thrilled to enroll 116 new apprentices in CEC programs- a record enrollment in the 12 year history of the Construction Education Center.

Legislative and PLAs

During the 2019 legislative session CT ABC scored a couple of notable wins. First, after years of attempts, we were able to deliver an important reform to CHRO. A new law requires the commissioner to rule on affirmative action plans within 120 days of submission. The absence of a ruling within that time frame will lead to plans being approved. This change will improve fairness and predictability for contractors working on state projects.

The issue of tolls dominated the 2019 legislative session and CT ABC entered the fray by taking a position against the governor's plan that would have erected 82 toll gantries across the state and collected tolls on all vehicles resulting in a significant cost to businesses and families. The highway tolling plan was defeated on multiple occasions throughout the year thanks to a coalition of opposition that CT ABC was a part of.

The story continues as the governor ended the year announcing a new \$21 billion transportation plan and, in concert with the building trades, has promised all of the work will be done subject to project labor agreements. Stopping this unprecedented attack on fair and open competition is our main priority as we head in to 2020.
